Grayrigg C of E Primary School has been allocated £1620 for the financial year 2018-19. This is allocated for the financial year which runs differently to the academic year, the aims below link to the academic year however the spending below is listed in relation to the financial year.

Grayrigg's Aims for use of PP

1. To support learning for the children who may not have support at home in comparison to their peers.
2. To support small group work for children who struggle to speak in class.
3. To purchase online learning for home that children can engage with without parental support.

Specific learning programmes to support dyslexia at home and in school for 1 and 3
