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Sports Premium 2015-16

The Government is providing funding of £150 million per annum for the academic years **2013/14 -2019/20** to provide new, substantial primary school sport funding. This funding is being jointly provided by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport, and will see money going directly to primary school Head teachers to spend on improving the quality of sport and PE for all their children. The sport funding can only be spent on sport and PE provision in schools. All schools will receive a lump sum of £8,000 plus a premium of £5 per pupil for the next five academic years and will have to spend the funding on improving their provision of PE and school sport, but they will have the freedom to choose how they do this.

Grayrigg's Aims to Improve Sport Provision 2015-16

- *Improve staff ability to deliver a range of sports activities during curriculum time.*
- *Improve range of outdoor sports available where children can compete with selves*
- *Enhance links to locally available clubs to increase out of school sports engagement.*
- *Further deliver a range of free after school physical activity clubs as there are no primary age clubs available in Grayrigg.*
