Who would have thought that we were going to start off this new year still having Covid regulations dominating much of what we do.

We had thought that the challenging restrictions that we coped with over 2020/21 would have largely gone, but it is not to be. We have to continue to measure risks for ourselves in all that we do, at home, work and in church. On January 6th we celebrate the Epiphany by remembering the visit of the Wise Men to Jesus. Magi who had embarked on a huge adventure, travelling not with a map but following a star, not quite sure where they would find the king they were seeking. Our understanding is that it took them 18 months or more of travelling and searching!

And they brought with them seemingly impractical gifts for a toddler; presents that pointed to Christ's true identity. Gold - a sign of kingship; Frankincense - used by priests in the Temple and a sign of Christ's priestly role in bridge-building between man and God; and Myrrh - used to embalm bodies, a sign of Jesus' future death on the cross.

Apart from these unusual gifts, the actions of the Wise Men can teach us some things that we need to be prepared to do, if we like them, wish to discover Jesus.

Like them we need to be prepared to search. The Wise Men had to be prepared to go on a journey to find Jesus, to leave behind the familiar and comfortable and seek for a king in the most unexpected place. In 2022 might we be more willing to search for Jesus, to put some effort into seeking the truth of him out? Like them we also need to exercise faith. Their journey must have been a hard one, they would have felt like giving up at times. Yet their conviction and determination helped them to keep on going, until their faith was rewarded at the end of the journey.

The last 18 months have been hard and I have heard more than one person say "what is the point of going on if this is all we have to look forward to?" I think those Wise Men show us that it is worth persevering. It may be difficult but they kept on going – they had faith in God. We don't know what is in store for us in the new year anymore than those wise men knew what was in store for them on their journey. But like them we have to ask ourselves who we are going to be placing our faith and trust in throughout 2022?

Part of my New Year Resolution for 2022 is to continue on my search for a greater knowledge of Christ, even if there are difficulties on that journey. Maybe it's an adventure you will join me in during 2022?
