### Sports Premium

**Having evaluated last years sports premium Grayrigg has developed the following strengths that we would like to continue:**

*Due to COVID some things that should be included in this year's Sports Premium have not happened-e.g. Swimming. Ideally anything missed as a result of COVID will be prioritised but the future is currently uncertain around opening up of school bubbles etc. The use of Sport premium in previous years has been effective as evaluated by OFSTED March 2020*

### Areas for development

School will work to use Sport funding to improve children's health both physically and mentally coming out of and during any lockdowns that happen as a result of COVID-19

### Grayrigg's Aims for use of SP

1. To upskill staff in how to coach children (including TAs) in areas set out in school long term planning.
2. To provide opportunities for all children to engage in physical activity during lockdowns.
3. To ensure all children can come into school for forest days before wider opening (may be through the summer) .
4. To ensure staff are qualified to deliver specific activities.
5. To develop the strengths in swimming to further stretch children with open water swimming.
6. Improve confidence in specific sports taught at secondary for all children transitioning.
7. Increased opportunity for physical activity post lockdowns
